

Driving the byway, visitors will see the evidence of booming and busting industries such as oil and gas, timber and crops as they pass endless acres of farmland and oil derricks. With more than 15 state-issued historic markers along the byway, you can discover location-specific history on your journey. Visitors can also experience the area's past through museum collections and exhibits that display pre- and post-Civil War artifacts and artwork.


